To Our Dear Readers,

We are so grateful to all of you who have contributed to the Chapel's preservation this year.

Did you know that the Maple Street Chapel is one of only 44 structures in DuPage County that are on the National Register of Historic Places?

Preservation of this landmark requires constant vigilance and is an ongoing expense:

- The fire sprinkler system, so vital to protect the wooden structure, is done, but at a total cost of almost \$168,000.
- Every 7 or 8 years we need to paint the Chapel, at a cost of \$60,000 (which of course goes up every time).
- It's only a once-every-100-years project, but we need to have some maintenance done to protect the bell which will cost \$7,000.

Contributions to our general fund are what make this vital work possible.

In addition, we always have small projects, such as refinishing a piece of furniture, to which you may specifically designate a donation.

The Lombard Historical Society

A Foundation for the Next 200 years



The Lombard Historical Society is embarking on a new construction adventure this fall. This project has been 3 years in the making.

The Sheldon Peck Homestead was built between 1837-1839 by Sheldon Peck and his sons. This property was built on a hand laid stone foundation that has remained for almost 180 years. Over time, the foundation has collapsed on the east end of the property closest to Grace St. A three phase plan has been adopted in order to repair the foundation as well as complete other aspects of the museum repair.

Phase 1: Archeological study of cellar and fixing rot of wood structures of the house, including painting of entire building. Completed October 2016.

Phase 2: Remove the floor in the east end of the building. Hand dig the soil under the house. Pour new foundation. Renovate kitchen and storage as well as creating a more handicapped accessible bathroom. Re-grade the property to divert water away from the house.

To be completed Fall 2017.

Phase 3: Repair foundation to cellar as needed.

We are looking forward to being able to literally support large groups of people again in the museum as we have been limiting the groups over the last year. Our funding for this project is ongoing. We have secured a no-interest loan from a private party and will work to repay the loan over the next four years. The Village of Lombard is also helping with the exterior grading as they are the owner of the property (LHS owns the house).
